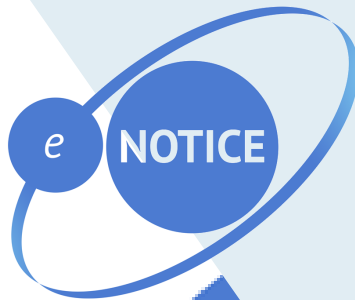

eNOTICE held the first meeting for training centres – network members – on September 20, 2019 in Dortmund, Germany, in the training centre of the Fire Department

Upcoming Joint Activities

The next eNOTICE Joint Activity will be held in Turkey on February 26-28, 2020 in Middle East Technical University, Ankara and Osmaniye University, Eskişehir. The Joint Activity will include three

serious games including scenarios from mining, eNOTICE's previous Joint Activities in Nimes (FR) and BioGarden in Peutie-Vilvoorde (BE) that took place in January and June 2018, respectively. The serious games will be played and tested with virtual and/or mixed reality. There will also be two field trips to the mines nearby Ankara and a serious gaming workshop with distinguished guests from Europe and Turkey.

Vyškov, Czech Republic, February 25-March 1, 2019 Host – JCBRND COE

This was the first time a Joint Activity (JA) took place at the JCBRND COE in Vyškov, Czech Republic, and it has to be planned and conducted in a slightly different way. The challenge was to combine and to integrate a regular residential course into an eNOTICE JA. The chosen course was the 'International Radiological Assistance Programme Training for Emergency Response (I-RAPTER) Basic Course 2019' including a practical training.

As the curriculum, planning and preparation of the I-RAPTER course is related to NATO education regulations and standards according to its Quality Control Process, there is no direct impact of improving the course as such. But, regarding the combination of the course with the JA there are still some actions to be taken to make the practical part even more successful.

These steps have been already identified and will be translated for the upcoming JA in Vyškov in 2021 where we would like to say

Gurcy, France, May 22-23, 2019, Host - SDIS77 & ARMINES

The regional CBRN multidisciplinary field exercise, was hosted by SDIS77 with active participation of Association pour la recherche et le développement de méthodes et processus industriels - ARMINES.

The backbone of the Joint Activity was set up by a multidisciplinary field training session under the authority of the French national civil-military CBRN training centre (CNCMFE). This training session is part of the national annual mandatory training plan. The objectives of the exercise were: to assess the interoperability of multidisciplinary civil-military teams in a terrorist attack situation; and to train security forces, first responders, HAZMAT teams and medical support units to work in close cooperation. The predefined evaluation criteria for the exercise were: 1) the capability of security forces to deal with a terrorist attack involving chemical warfare agents; 2) the capability of SDIS77 first responders to support the security forces, extract the victims from the hazardous area & carry out the assessment of the contaminated area (detection, sampling, zone marking). The virtual deployment of a field hospital was hosted by ARMINES. The aim of this course was to evaluate the interoperability between a large scale exercise and a serious game exercise based on the same CBRN scenario. Therefore, a virtual mobile field hospital was deployed to quickly take care of the victims. The goal was to setup a serious game (virtual training device) designed to prepare the emergency medical teams of a field hospital before their intervention.

Birmingham, UK, July 11, 2019

Host – WMP

UK CBRN emergency response uses continuous professional development (CPD) to work together to refresh and enhance their CBRN knowledge. This 1 day TTX was a regional event, hosted by West Midlands Police, and led by the National CBRN Centre CPD team. In Birmingham the EU H2020 project PROACTIVE joined a regional CBRN table top exercise run by the UK National CBRN Centre (WMP partner). PROACTIVE project members were included as delegates and completed the exercise alongside UK police, fire, ambulance, local authority, education, and military commanders.

The Joint Activity in Birmingham showed that the eNOTICE project provides a wealth of opportunity to network. By bringing academia, industry, and R&D together with emergency responders and commanders, and opening up a public sector exercise to the private sector, a refreshing, innovative and well regarded experience was achieved.

Dortmund, Germany, Sep 21, 2019, Host - FDDO

The large multidisciplinary full scale exercise, hosted by the Fire Department of Dortmund – FDDO (Germany) and supported by the Scientific and Research Centre for Fire Protection - CNBOP-PIB (Poland), both partners of eNOTICE. The focused scenario of the exercise was an accident of a tank wagon with chemical substances. Result of the accident was a leakage of a liquid from the tank wagon, which was not identified due to an incomplete and illegible marking. During the exercise the structures of emergency management in Dortmund were presented (fire protection, rescuing, analytics, decontamination etc.), including the involvement of novel reconnaissance concepts by the use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) provided by CNBOP

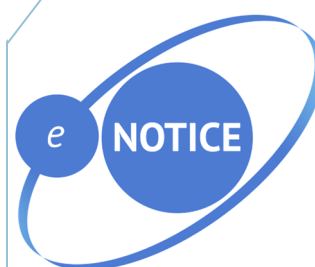
